Dear SJCHS Healthcare Providers,

Effective May 15th, 2019 testing listed below will no longer be performed in house. Testing is available from the reference laboratory with an expected turn-around-time of less than 48 hours. O&P comprehensives have an expected turn-around-time of 3-7 days. New test names are as follows:

Cryptococcus Ag by EIA, CSF Cryptococcus Ag by EIA, Serum Legionella Pneumophila Antigen Fat, Fecal Qualitative Rotavirus Antigen by EIA, Stool Ova & Parasite Comprehensive

Note: If a parasite infection is suspected as a cause of persistent diarrhea (>14) days, specific pathogen testing is recommended. Suggested guidelines are O&P screen for Giardia/Cryptosporidium. If screening is negative and patient has a history of travel or are immunocompromised, then a GI panel may be justified. A GI panel includes cyclospora, cryptosporidium, E. histolytica, Giardia, STEC, and other common bacterial and viral pathogens. It is also recommended to collect three separate stool specimens over a 5-7 day period for a O&P examination.
